Anna Lee 9 AM: **The Water Element:** How Permaculture Works With the Lifeblood of Our Mother Earth.

Water is Life. Everything on Earth depends upon it. Our bodies consist mainly of water. Without it we die. It is the primary formative Element in Chinese Medical Theory. When we understand the importance of Water we know we must hold ourselves to the **Three Ethics** of Permaculture in regard to how we view, use, and respect Water.

Let's explore Wildcat Creek in terms of water....how it comes on and off this land, how it flows, how it is captured and used or not, how it could be approached differently, what other aspects here affect water on this land. After our talk and walk we will spend some hands-on time on a project for water recycling on site and transform a corner of this land into a place of beauty and enhanced utility.

Anna Lee has been studying, researching, practicing and teaching permaculture for eight years. Her home, LuLuLand, is permaculture designed throughout and serves as a learning center for others to be inspired to create not only functional but also beautiful habitats for humans and all the Earth's creatures. A large focus of her efforts has been with water catchment systems using recycled materials and imagination. Her background in Chinese Medicine and natural foods keep returning to weave through her understanding of what Permaculture has to offer.
